New Grass Maintenance: This information comes from Sod King in North Ft. Myers: FOR ALL THE NEW GRASS BEING INSTALLED

1. Water daily for the first 30 days. Best time to water 12 am - 8 am

2. After 30 days – you should use "Turf Grass Starting Fertilizer" or "Palm tree fertilizer." These will assist in thickening the roots for proper development. Use a 5/10/10 or 8/10/10 low nitrogen fertilizer.

3. Apply regular fertilizer 45 days **after** palm tree fertilizer. Use a regular slow release 16/4/8.
